

# Pupil Premium Update – Number 4

## Evidence of Impact and Driving Progress: Our two top priorities still have to be:

- (1) To close the gap between Pupil Premium and non-PP at the school
- (2) To close the gap between Pupil Premium and overall national average

## Review of key strategies

Strategy	Review
Appointment of PP champion	This has raised the profile of PP in the school and Jamie Parkinson has presented to Governors on this aspect. Documentation produced has been instrumental in achievement of objectives
Smaller maths / English groups	Very successful in increasing teacher contact time, marking and feedback leading to positive outcomes.
Individual case studies	This has allowed all staff to accurately track progress and provision of children in class and teaching sets.
1:1 tuition for Year 6 pupils	Very successful where administered but low take up from PP children – consider changing the times of sessions
Feedback on half termly basis by year groups	Whole school awareness of progress and attainment including performances of specific groups and associated targets
Reduced payment for residential visits	Allowed a significant number of PP children to participate in residential trips across the school.
Free extra curricular activities	All pupils in school have equal access to a range of clubs regardless of status

## Impact

### Performance against National Outcomes by pupil premium children:

1. The Ofsted Inspection Dashboard highlights that Performance in the National End of Key Stage 2 tests by disadvantaged pupils show that progress was not significantly below average overall or for any prior attainment group in any subject. Attainment in reading for disadvantaged pupils was equal to or above the national score for all pupils
2. Attendance for pupil premium children is 94% compared to a national average of 95% and a school average of 95%
3. Opportunities for all pupils in the school are equally distributed and accessed.
4. Teachers have access to a wider range of data relating to the children they teach and support which in turn leads to improved provision.
