PLAYSCRIPTS

A PLAYSCRIPT TELLS A STORY AND SHOWS CHARACTERS MOSTLY THROUGH DIALOGUE. THERE ARE ESSENTIALLY TWO AUDIENCES YOU NEED TO THINK ABOUT WHEN WRITING A PLAYSCRIPT:

- THE ACTORS THEY NEED TO KNOW WHAT TO DO AND SAY
- THE PEOPLE WATCHING THE PLAY YOU WANT THEM TO REALLY ENJOY IT



- SETTING OF THE SCENE (A SHORT DESCRIPTION OF WHERE THE SCENE IS SET)
- STAGE DIRECTIONS IN BRACKETS (WHAT YOU NEED TO TELL YOUR ACTORS TO DO I.E. HOW THEY MOVE AND HOW THEY SPEAK)
- CHARACTERS NAMES ARE WRITTEN ON THE LEFT AND ARE FOLLOWED BY A COLON
- NO SPEECH MARKS FOR DIALOGUE!
