English

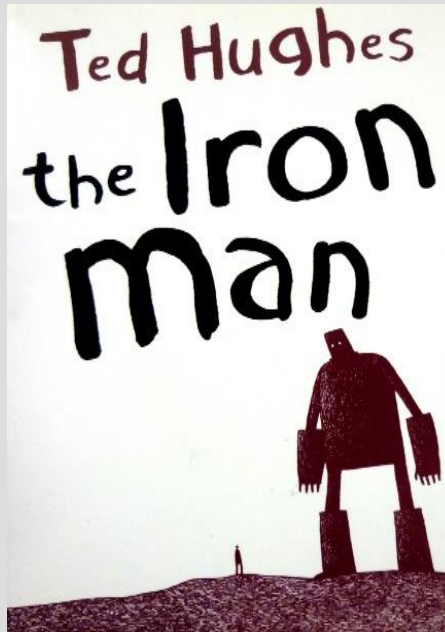
- Can you write a diary entry as Hogarth?
