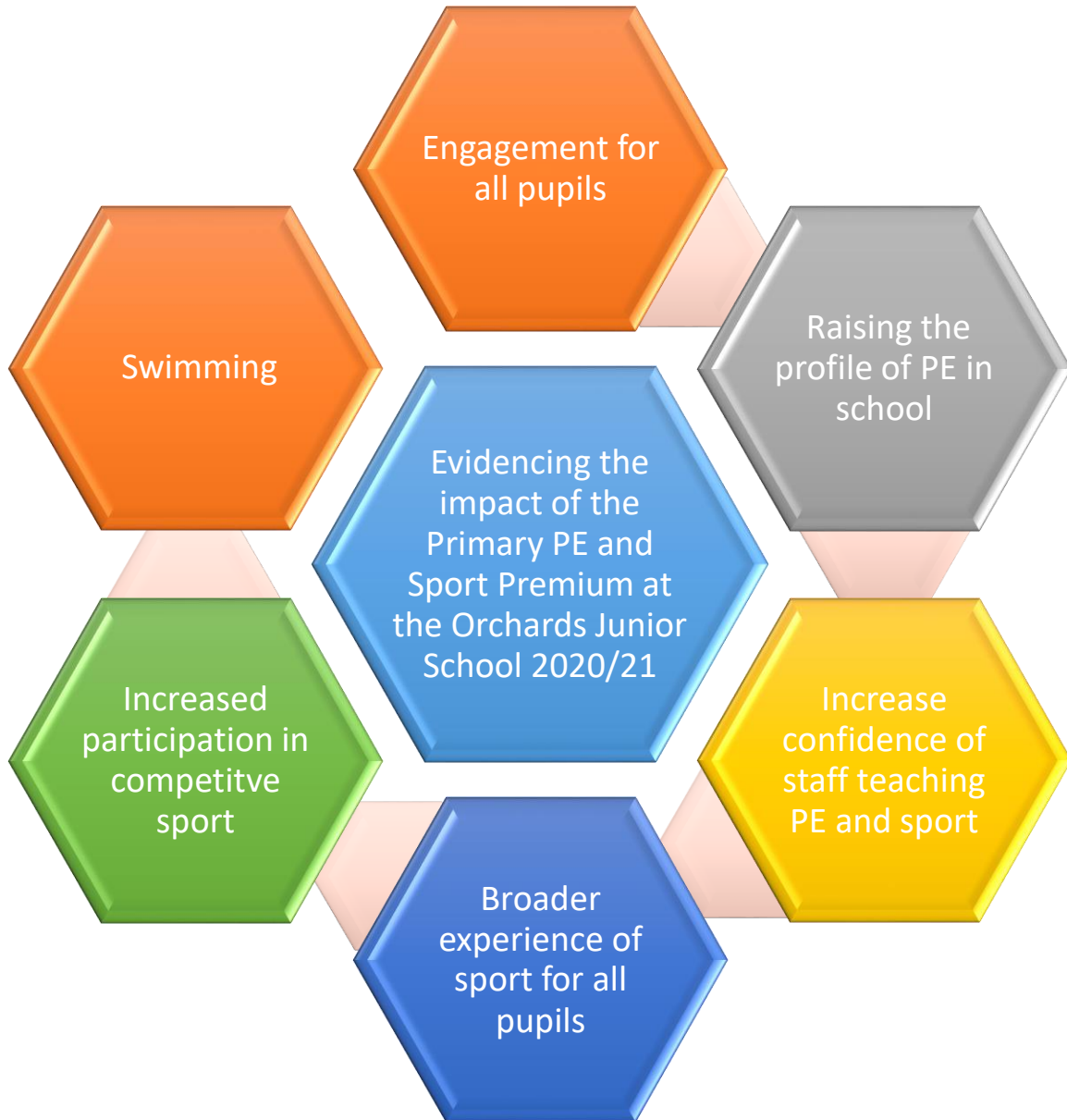

Swimming 2020/21

Swimming statistics for current year 6 pupils (149 pupils)

Percentage of current year 6 pupils able to confidently swim 25 metres 72%

Percentage of pupils that can use a range of swimming strokes confidently 60%

Percentage of pupils that can self-rescue in different water based situations 72%

Targets to increase swimming skills. We are now using a new swimming pool and teaching provider and are finding this to be a huge success. Arundel Lido were able to provide 7 weeks of swimming lessons for all pupils in year 5 during 2020/21 Littlehampton Swimming Centre has been closed to school swimming during this time.

1. Identify pupils who need extra swimming support and select for TOP up swimming sessions at

Arundel Lido.

2. Increase the provision for swimming at the school. Start lessons in year 4 and continue in year 5.

Pupils will then have the opportunity if required to 'top up' in year 6.

3. Identify swimming opportunities for parents to take their own children swimming. Local discounts and special offers etc.
