The three time periods of the Stone Age

What does prehistoric mean?

Long before people appeared on <u>Earth</u>, other forms of life existed. Many of these living things are now extinct, meaning they have died out completely. The period when they lived is called prehistory, or prehistoric times

Why is the Stone Age called the Stone Age?

It is called the Stone Age because it is characterised by when early humans, sometimes known as cavemen, started using stone, such as flint, for tools and weapons. They also used stones to light fires. These stone tools are the earliest known human tools
